<b>Title</b> Situational Analysis
<b>Areas of Work / Skills</b> Analysis skills in different environments
<b>Duration</b>
<b>Resources Required</b>
<b>Related information</b>
<b>Detail (step-by-step explanation of the task)</b>  Text analysis of a person – video tape of a sitcom/documentary etc sound off look at the tape and say from only body language, who is happy or who agrees with who, their demeanour.  Analysis of the situation – where are we now, why am I here to interpret who are these people. Linked to the idea is it parent/teacher, is it a job interview, and is it a mixed audience of deaf and hearing. Has the person presenting worked with Deaf people before? Do people know each other? Is it a new experience for those involved?  We can learn from who they are and the situation what the meaning of their presentation is.  Text that you hear- Snippets of conversation that you hear in the street – then try to decide if they are happy, what are they talking about, who are they talking about.
